

12 Steps for Start of Studies for Internationals at KIT

What?	Where?
<p>1 Finding accommodation: In most cities with good universities it is difficult to find accommodation. This is also the case in Karlsruhe. So please start looking for accommodation such as an apartment, a room, or a room in a shared apartment (WG) as early as possible. You can get help from the Studierendenwerk Karlsruhe. They also have a housing scout who can assist you. It is easier to find an accommodation outside Karlsruhe. Fortunately, Karlsruhe has a very good transportation system and you can quickly get to KIT by bus or streetcar even from further away. You can find information about ticket options under further information on finding accommodation.</p> <p>If you have not yet found a room, reserve a room at a youth hostel or hostel.</p>	From at home/upon arrival in Karlsruhe
<p>2 Registration of Your Residence: When you move into an accommodation, you must notify the competent authority. You must do this within the first 2 weeks.</p> <p>This also applies to students who move within the city or municipality.</p> <p>All students who move within Germany can also register online. You can find all the relevant information here.</p> <p>If you do not wish to register online, you can find all the information you need on this page. To do so, you must make an appointment with the authorities. You will need the following items to register: your passport, your electronic residence permit or visa, confirmation of residence (which must be completed by your landlord), and a registration form (which you must complete; English version only for information purposes). These forms can be also found on this page under "Forms and other offers."</p> <p>All students who come to Karlsruhe or the surrounding area from abroad must go to a citizens' office in person.</p> <p>If you do not live in Karlsruhe or the surrounding area, please check the Internet to find out how to register at your new place of residence.</p> <p>You only need to register within two weeks if you are moving in permanently and not just for a short-term sublease.</p> <p>If you move to Karlsruhe, you can receive a welcome package through the first residence campaign of the city of Karlsruhe.</p> <p>In many places you can call 115 and get help from the office.</p>	Citizen offices in Karlsruhe Other places: please check the Internet to find out how to register at your new place of residence.
<p>3 Students from countries outside the EU need a national visa for educational and study purposes (no tourist visa!) to enter Germany. You should apply for this visa at the German Embassy responsible for you at the latest when you receive your admission. Exceptions can be found on the pages of the International Students Office (IStO). Get help with your visa application at https://platform.visaflow.app/auth with the code KIT25.</p> <p>Applying for a Residence Title: Before your entry visa expires, it is essential that you apply for an eAT (electronic residence title = residence permit) to study at the local Aliens Registration Office. The Aliens Registration Office depends on your place of residence: Ausländerbehörde Stadt Karlsruhe (Aliens Registration Office City of Karlsruhe), Ausländerbehörde Landratsamt Karlsruhe (Aliens Registration Office District Office Karlsruhe). <p>4 Semester Charges: Please pay your semester charges! The amount can be found in the notification of charges. Use the bank data and the individual purpose of payment given in the information letter. Please keep your account statement/receipt for enrollment. Pay by bank transfer from your home country OR from a bank account in Germany.</p> <p>You will have to re-register every semester by paying your semester charges in advance and continue to have a health insurance.</p> <p><u>Registration periods:</u> Summer semester: January 15 – February 15, Winter semester: July 1 – August 15. If you pay too late, you will have to pay 18 € in addition. If you do not pay at all, you will be exmatriculated.</p>	From at home/upon arrival in Karlsruhe, PRIOR TO enrollment Re-register online: https://campus.studium.kit.edu/english/renewal/index.php
<p>5 Health insurance: For enrollment, KIT needs an electronic notification for the health insurance. Please ask your health insurance provider for "Meldegrund 10 für das Karlsruher Institut für Technologie". Please read this further information about health insurance.</p>	Upon arrival in Germany or digitally from your country
<p>6 Enrollment: This page describes what you need to do in sequence for online enrollment (matriculation).</p>	Upon arrival in Karlsruhe or digitally from your country with a visa to study
<p>7 KIT-Account & Studierendenausweis: On the page https://www.scc.kit.edu/en/services/firstsemester.php you can find all information how to get a KIT-Account (KIT user account - KIT-Benutzerkonto) and a KIT-Card (student ID - Studierendenausweis). There is also the YouTube video "How to ErstI #1: the KIT-Card", which explains the KIT-Card (in German language). There are various information events as well as social and sports activities where you can get to know other international students. <p>9 O-Phasen (Orientation Phasen): The student council is a group of students in the department. They organize orientation phases (O-Phasen) for all new students at the beginning of their studies. You can find an overview of the dates of the O-Phasen on the ASTA page or ask the faculty. Please be sure to attend your program's O-Phase to receive important information about your studies and to get to know your fellow students.</p> <p>Many departments offer Mentoring-programs for first semester students. <p>10 Important offers on campus: You will find an extensive range of events and support formats for international students from our partners. Please inform yourself about the offer and participate.</p>	See respective link

11	<p>Updating Your Data on the Students Portal: As soon as you have an accommodation or move in, update your new address. This also has to be done when you move later on during your studies. In Campus Management you will manage most things during your studies, such as registering for an exam. 12	<p>Opening a Bank Account: This is only possible with a rental contract, registration of residence and your tax number (from the Tax Office). Usually, the tax number will be sent to you by the Tax Office 14 days upon registration with the city. To open a bank account, you will need your passport, registration with the city, admission letter/enrollment certificate, tax number. Most banks offer to have the account opened online in combination with PostIdent (at a post office). Complete the form online. To identify yourself via PostIdent, complete the form online and take the documents to a post office.</p>	Many banks offer cost-free accounts for students. Inform yourself on the websites.
